


Dear Jason and the NCP Staff,

As we enter the final year of National College Planners preparing the FAFSA forms and paperwork necessary to enable our last daughter to finish her college experience, I would like to take the opportunity to express our sincere thanks for all of yours (and your staff) assistance in making it possible to accomplish what I initially thought was an impossible mission. A friend of ours told us that we would possibly have a better chance in sending our daughters to private colleges and universities due to the availability of scholarships and grants. I had no idea how to go about this process so I attended one of your seminars about 6 years ago. As we spoke afterwards, I remember you saying something like "you seem to be educated enough in the financial world, why don't you just do it yourself".
