


Dear Jason,

One of our primary objectives in coming to the United States from the Philippines was for our youngest daughter to complete her college degree in Communications here. The problem was we were completely ignorant of the system of admissions, accreditations, scholarships, educational assistance, grants and all the requirements and documentation that it entailed. When we saw an ad in a local newspaper that promised to teach us the system, we immediately signed up. In the seminar we met Jason Youngblood. In that free one hour seminar, we learned more about the complex system of US College Education than we could ever have, fending for ourselves. The best part of it was it was presented in a simple no nonsense, easy to understand manner. When he handed out business cards and brochures at the end of the seminar we were among the first in line. We were so interested that we even waited for everyone else to go and walked with him to the car.

Needless to say, we signed up for the consulting services. Jason and NCP guided our daughter through the entire process helping her focus on the course that she wanted to take, helping her choose the appropriate college for her course given the parameters of distance, costs, available grants and student assistance, quality of education, lodging, and so on. They prepared her for exams and interviews, and guided her through all the submissions. They helped her arrange and schedule campus tours for the colleges that she was considering, and after that sent her reminders of the schedules for these tests, interviews and tours. With the help of NCP, our daughter was admitted as a transfer student to CSU-Los Angeles, where she started on her chosen major of Film Production. **We received \$15,215 in financial aid money, \$10,372 of that in free grant money. We are excited that by the end of her four years we will have saved \$41,488 that we never have to pay back!** NCP was present through all this, providing advice, moral support and lots of hand holding.

As far as the continuing services are concerned, this too has been extremely valuable. We receive emails from NCP reminding us to prepare document requirements that are to be submitted to the government and to schools for annual grant renewals or in preparation for enrollment. These emails arrive during times that we are most likely to forget to prepare these necessary papers, like just before the Christmas holidays.

Our daughter will be (hopefully) graduating in Spring of 2014. Throughout our family's journey through the hallowed halls of the US educational system, NCP has been our guide, our helper, our consultant and our friend. We are grateful to Jason and his team for all these years because we definitely would not have been able to accomplish this without their invaluable support.
