As an alumnus of California Lutheran University, I look back at my experience at stumbling through the college application process and the completion of the FASFA forms. With my former experience and as a CPA here in California, I felt that I was as qualified as anyone to assist my daughter through the process.

However, as the time approached for my daughter to attend college, even I felt that I didn't have enough specific knowledge and an understanding of the current process. I attended one of the information seminars and was impressed at how you would walk us through everything step by step.


You were instrumental in helping my daughter stay on the appropriate timeline and assisted her in finding and discovering which colleges were suited to her selected major using your extensive database. You answered questions we had regarding SAT. When it came time for her to apply for colleges, you assisted her with writing her essays and filling out the applications. This totals to \$185,200 over four years of free money.**
